IT'S TIME TO GIVE PATIENTS LIKE RUSHI AN EQUAL CHANCE OF FINDING A MATCH.



When 8-year-old Rushi asked to join the baseball team with his friends last spring, his doctors told him it was too dangerous. When he asked about soccer or running, the answer was the same—“No.”

Diagnosed with beta thalassemia major before birth, Rushi has made countless trips to the hospital and needs blood transfusions every three weeks. He's at risk of heart and liver failure, and physical activity puts him at risk of rupturing his enlarged spleen.

Rushi excels in school, attends math enrichment classes, and pursues his passion for sports cars, but he really wants to play sports with his friends.

“It's getting to him,” explains his mother, Nilima. “I see him playing on the computer trying to forget he can't do what other kids can because of his condition.”

Rushi's best hope for a cure is a blood stem cell transplant. Unfortunately, there is currently no genetic match for Rushi on the Be The Match Registry.®

Rushi's parents are from India, so he's most likely to match a donor who shares his South Asian ancestry. But of the 20 million potential donors on the Be The Match Registry, less than 300,000—or only 1.3%—identify as South Asian. Currently, South Asian patients only have a 38% chance of finding a match. Adding more South Asian members ups the odds, to help give patients like Rushi hope for a healthy future.

“Now that he's older Rushi understands why he doesn't have the energy to do things, but his anxiety on transfusion days is very high,” Nilima said. “We tell him he has to be strong, but most of all, we just want him to find a donor so he can be healthy.”

IT'S TIME

TO HELP PATIENTS LIKE ROMAN FIND THEIR LIFE-SAVING MATCH

Roman is a delightful 3-year-old boy who was diagnosed with Shwachman-Diamond syndrome when he was only 6 months old. This rare disease causes him to produce zero white blood cells, which are necessary for fighting infection. Something as minor as a common cold could kill him.

Roman has been in and out of the hospital his whole life. His doctors have done everything in their power to manage his symptoms, but a blood stem cell transplant from a matched donor is the only hope for a cure. Roman's blood work started to change recently and the family fears that a transplant will be needed soon.

"We were told that there was a less than 1% chance of Roman finding his match because of his mixed, Chinese/Italian heritage," said Roman's mom, Nicole. "But you know what? 'I'm his mom, I WILL find his match, no matter what. I carry swabs in my purse. I'll register anyone I meet."

TO RISE UP, TO SHATTER RECORDS AND CREATE A NEW REALITY

Lemons for Leukemia Challenge sets new world record

When Chris Betancourt, 20, was diagnosed with chronic myeloid leukemia, he was given one year to live. When his best friend, Dillon Hill, 19, got the news, he took time off from college to help.

"I couldn't sit in a lecture hall while he was potentially dying. Chris was afraid of not being able to experience things in life he wanted to do, so we made a bucket list and documented every single moment of it," Dillon said.

One of the items was to set a world record for blood stem cell donor registrations in 24 hours. The pair created the Lemons for Leukemia Challenge, which involved posting a video of yourself biting down on a raw lemon, challenging others to do the same, and encouraging people to join the Be The Match Registry®.

The campaign went viral, landing a spot on Good Morning America, where anchor Robin Roberts, who is a blood stem cell transplant recipient herself, accepted the challenge.

IT'S TIME

TO MAKE TRANSPLANT FINANCIALLY ACCESSIBLE TO EVERY PATIENT

Instead of being surrounded by family, balloons and party favors to celebrate her 1st birthday, Dezi was surrounded by doctors and medical equipment. When Dezi was diagnosed with acute myeloid leukemia, her parents went from thinking about birthday gifts to figuring out how they would get her the life-saving blood stem cell transplant she needed—especially since their insurance wouldn't cover the cost to help them find her match.

Thankfully, a Search Assistance Fund grant from the Be The Match Foundation® made it possible to find her a cord blood unit without delay.

Additionally, a Transplant Support Assistance grant of \$2,000 helped offset the costs associated with having to move close to the transplant center, as well as lost income due to Dezi's mom Dessica having to quit her job to care for her daughter.

IT'S TIME

TO ADVOCATE ON BEHALF OF PATIENTS

Lisa Maxson lives with her husband and three children in the small, close-knit community of Troy, Ohio, just outside of Columbus. When she was diagnosed with acute myeloid leukemia, there was no donor match for her in her family. Fortunately, she was able to receive a life-saving cord blood transplant.

Out of gratitude and a desire to pay it forward to help other patients, Lisa and her dad, Tom, have been instrumental in hosting the Buckeye Walk+Run To Go event, raising more than \$40,000 for Be The Match in the last few years.

In addition to their own efforts, Lisa and Tom participated in Legislative Advocacy training to share their experience with lawmakers to help improve all patients' access to treatment.

Be The Match BioTherapies partners with companies advancing new cell and gene therapies. In 2018, as an extension of our life-saving mission, we:


- Provided services to 14 cell and gene therapy companies to help develop 12 new therapies



MOORE FAMILY GIVES \$1 MILLION TO SUPPORT TRANSPLANT RESEARCH



Longtime supporters Tom and Sally Moore recently made a \$1 million gift to the Be The Match Foundation®, to advance transplant research through the Amy Strelzer Manasevit Research Program. Their gift was inspired by their granddaughter Lauren's transplant experience, and their desire to help other patients and families.

Today, Sally describes nine-year-old Lauren as “vivacious, fast, furious, full of fun, with a great sense of humor.” She’s come a long way since 2011 when she was first diagnosed with rare, T-cell acute lymphoblastic leukemia. She was hospitalized for multiple rounds of chemotherapy when she was only two years old. Realizing Lauren’s only chance of a cure would be a blood stem cell transplant from

a genetically matched donor, Lauren’s doctors began a search of the Be The Match Registry®.

Lauren’s mother, Nicole was nine months pregnant at the time with Lauren’s baby brother, Tommy. While a transplant of blood stem cells collected from the umbilical cord blood might have provided a cure for Lauren, they were not a close enough genetic match. That’s not unusual, as 70 percent of patients who need a transplant do not find a fully matched donor in their family.

Fortunately, a donor was found—a young woman named Kristen—who had joined the registry when she was in high school, and followed through on her promise a few years later to provide Lauren’s cure.


